A short narration of the program

The "100 People Project": Outreach Visit to Prem Niwas – Home for the Aged

In commemoration of the centenary of the All India Catholic University Federation (AICUF), the AICUF unit of St. Vincent College initiated the "100 People Project", a series of outreach engagements aimed at fostering social responsibility and compassionate action among students. As part of this initiative, a visit was organized to Prem Niwas – Home for the Aged on 1st February 2025.

Eighteen AICUF student volunteers participated in the visit with the primary objectives of:

- Building meaningful intergenerational connections,
- Promoting empathy and awareness of the psychosocial challenges faced by elderly citizens,
- Encouraging a spirit of service and solidarity among the youth, and
- Bringing joy and companionship to the residents through active engagement.

The program commenced with warm introductions that facilitated rapport between the students and residents. This was followed by a series of interactive activities, including group singing and light-hearted games, which were met with enthusiastic participation from the elderly. Many residents fondly shared songs and stories from their youth, creating a deeply enriching and reciprocal exchange of memories and emotions.

In addition to emotional and social support, the AICUF team extended practical assistance by donating essential food items such as fresh fruits and nutritious biscuits, thereby contributing to the residents' well-being.



The visit concluded on a poignant note, with both students and residents expressing reluctance to part ways.

Several students voiced a strong desire to return, reflecting the genuine bonds formed during the engagement. Post-visit reflections highlighted a heightened sense of gratitude, humility, and social consciousness among the participants.

This outreach not only fulfilled its intended objectives but also reaffirmed the transformative power of compassionate presence. It stands as a testament to St. Vincent College's commitment to nurturing socially aware, empathetic, and service-oriented leaders. The AICUF unit looks forward to sustaining and expanding such initiatives in alignment with the college's mission of holistic and value-based education.
