## How to Read a Book Critically and Book Selection Fr. (Dr.) Kenneth Misquitta, SJ

#### **Introduction:**

A workshop on "How to Read a Book Critically and Book Selection" was organized on January 2nd under the guidance of Fr. (Dr.) Kenneth Misquitta, SJ. The primary objective of the workshop was to equip students and faculty with critical reading skills and methodologies for selecting appropriate books effectively. The event witnessed an enthusiastic participation of 35 students along with teachers, making it a highly interactive and insightful session.

#### **Objectives of the Workshop:**

- 1. To enhance critical reading skills among students and teachers.
- 2. To develop an analytical approach toward reading and comprehension.
- 3. To provide techniques for effective book selection based on content relevance, authenticity, and academic value.
- 4. To encourage a habit of reading with a discerning and evaluative perspective.

## **Workshop Structure:**

The workshop was structured into multiple engaging sessions, each focusing on different aspects of critical reading and book selection.

#### **Session 1: Understanding Critical Reading**



Fr. (Dr.) Kenneth Misquitta, SJ, introduced the concept of critical reading, emphasizing the difference between passive reading and active, analytical engagement with a text. Participants were guided through strategies such as:

- Identifying the author's perspective and argument.
- Evaluating the credibility of sources.
- Recognizing biases and assumptions in texts.
- Making logical connections between ideas presented in different books and articles.

#### **Session 2: Techniques for Effective Book Selection**

The second session focused on methods for selecting books that align with academic and personal learning goals. Key aspects covered included:

- Understanding the importance of book reviews, summaries, and bibliographies.
- Assessing the authority of authors and publishers.
- Comparing editions and translations for accuracy and readability.
- Recognizing the role of libraries and digital resources in book selection.

#### **Session 3: Practical Engagement and Interactive Activities**

To reinforce the concepts learned, participants engaged in hands-on activities:

- Analyzing sample texts to identify biases and core arguments.
- Conducting comparative analysis of different books on the same topic.
- Simulated exercises on book selection using library and online resources.

#### **Key Takeaways:**

- Critical reading is an essential skill for academic and professional success.
- Effective book selection enhances research quality and personal knowledge.
- A structured approach to reading can lead to better comprehension and retention.
- Libraries and digital platforms offer extensive resources for informed book selection.
