Group Reading Session (साम् हक वाचन) Under the Program "Vachan Sankalp Maharashtracha"

Introduction

As part of the "Vachan Sankalp Maharashtracha" initiative, the Library Committee of St. Vincent College organized a Group Reading Session (सामू हक वाचन) on January 14, 2024. The session aimed to inculcate reading habits among students, enhance comprehension skills, and foster a collective appreciation for literature and knowledge sharing.

Objectives of the Group Reading Session

The primary objectives of the session were:

- To encourage students to develop a habit of regular reading.
- To improve language proficiency and comprehension skills.
- To promote a sense of community and shared learning through reading.
- To introduce students to a variety of literary works and genres.

Details of the Activity

- Over 100 students actively participated in the session, demonstrating great enthusiasm and engagement.
- The session was structured into different segments:
- Selection of Books and Reading Materials: A variety of books, newspapers, and journals in different languages were provided for reading.
- o Silent Reading: Students read their selected books quietly to focus on comprehension and reflection.



- Group Reading and Discussion: Students formed small groups to read aloud and discuss key themes and ideas from their selected texts.
- The books and materials covered included:
- Marathi Literature: Works by renowned Marathi authors such as P. L. Deshpande, V. S. Khandekar, and Durga Bhagwat.
- o English Literature: Classic novels, poetry, and contemporary fiction.
- o Inspirational and Motivational Books: Writings by Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, Swami Vivekananda, and Mahatma Gandhi.
- Historical and Biographical Works: Books covering significant historical events and biographies of eminent personalities.
- Newspapers and Magazines: Current affairs, editorial columns, and opinion pieces for awareness and critical thinking development.

Student and Faculty Participation

- Faculty members guided students in selecting books and facilitated discussions on key takeaways from the readings.
- Students actively participated in group discussions, sharing insights and personal interpretations of the texts.
- Some students voluntarily read aloud passages from selected books, enhancing their public speaking and expression skills.

Feedback and Responses

- Students found the session highly engaging and expressed interest in participating in similar activities regularly.
- Faculty members appreciated the initiative, highlighting its role in enhancing students' language skills and critical thinking abilities.
- Suggestions were made to introduce thematic reading sessions and invite guest speakers for future events.
